GASOLINE DOWN

Memorial Day weekend in the United States marks the start of the summer and, therefore, of increased driving, which usually means increased demand and higher gasoline prices. This year, contrary to this expectation, the price of gasoline has gone down, defying several supposedly inevitable forecasts.

El feriado del Día de los Veteranos en Estados Unidos marca el principio del verano y por ende aumenta la circulación de autos, lo cual usualmente significa que aumenta la demanda y los precios de la gasolina. Este año, en contra de esta expectativa, el precio de la gasolina ha bajado, desafiando varios pronósticos supuestamente inevitables.

Organization of Petroleum Exporting Countries plus Russia persist, and they are expected to be renewed at the next June meeting. But increased production in the Americas, in Brazil, Canada, Guyana and the United States, has compensated for the production shortfall. Last month, West Texas Intermediate crude prices approached \$90 per barrel, but they fell to under \$80 this month. Therefore, the national average price of regular gasoline went down this week to \$3.58 per gallon, from \$3.67 in April.

However, another astonishing fact is that contrary to what was usual in the past, this time the price of oil has gone down, despite the conflicts in Eastern Europe and the Middle East.

Finally, also defying expectations, according to the Federal Highway Administration (quoted in The Wall Street Journal 05/24/24) drivers in the United States during this year's first quarter drove a record 763 billion miles. But demand for gasoline did not increase, mostly because of the growing number of hybrid and electric vehicles circulating throughout the country.

Por ejemplo, persisten los recortes de producción aprobados por la Organización de Países Exportadores de Petróleo más Rusia y se espera que sean renovados durante la próxima reunión de junio. Pero crecientes aumentos en la producción en las Américas, en Brasil, Canadá, Estados Unidos y Guyana han compensado dichos recortes de la producción. El mes pasado, el precio del crudo cotizado como West Texas Intermediate se acercó a \$90 por barril, pero este mes disminuyó a menos de \$80. Por consiguiente, el precio promedio nacional de la gasolina regular esta semana bajó a \$3.58 por galón, desde \$3.67 en abril.

Otro hecho asombroso es que en contra de lo que era usual en el pasado, esta vez el precio del petróleo ha bajado, a pesar de los conflictos en Europa Oriental y el Medio Oriente.

Finalmente, también desafiando expectativas, según la Administración Federal de Carreteras (citada en el Wall Street Journal 05|24|24), los conductores de autos en Estados Unidos durante el primer trimestre de este año recorrieron la cifra sin precedente de 763,000 millones de millas. Pero la demanda de gasolina no aumentó, en gran parte debido al creciente número de automóviles híbridos y eléctricos que circulan a lo largo del país.

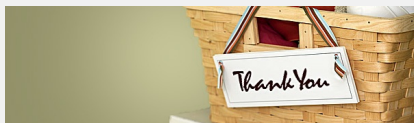
